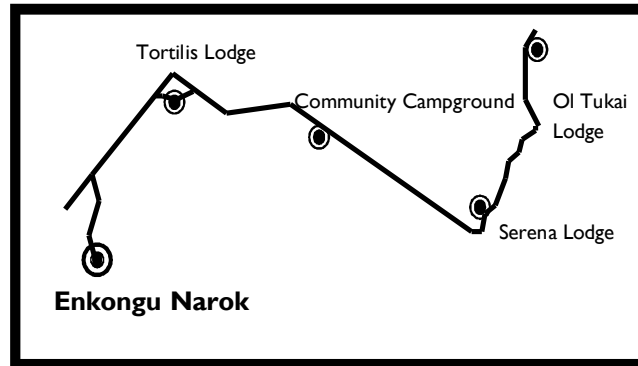

As Maasai people struggle with balancing the education of their children and the cultural survival of their people, Enkongu Narok bridges age-old practices with a contemporary curriculum. The school is attended by children from the surrounding villages and is vital in opening the doors of opportunity.

Support the Beading Cooperative

In order to combat the competitive and degrading atmosphere of jewelry sales in much of Maasailand, Enkongu Narok established a beading cooperative. Sales from the co-op are shared equally among participating families and a percentage goes directly to support vital infrastructure. For example, the purchase of a bracelet buys a school uniform and two necklaces buy a year's worth of school supplies.
